1. RESPECT

States shall respect and ensure all rights of persons participating in assemblies



2. INALIENABLE

Every person has the inalienable right to take part in peaceful assemblies



3. LIMITED RESTRICTIONS

Restrictions imposed on peaceful assemblies shal comply with internationa human rights standards



4. FORCE

Force shall not be used unless it is strictly unavoidable, and if applied it must be done in accordance with international human rinhts law

5. FACILITATION

States shall facilitate the exercise of the right to peaceful assembly



6. OBSERVATION

Every person shall enjoy the right to observe, monitor and record assemblies



7. PRIVACY

information of person information must not interfere impermissibly with privacy or other rights



8. INFORMATION

Every person has the right to access information related to assemblies

9. BUSINESSES

Business enterprises have a responsibility to respect human rights in the context of assemblies

10. ACCOUNTABILITY

The State and its organs shall be held accountable for their actions in relation to assemblies
