MONITORING OF INTIMIDATION AND VIOLENCE

Report (10-17 July 1998)

This is the third factual report on human rights in relation to political intimidation and violence. It has been compiled by the Cambodia Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (COHCHR) on behalf of the Special Representative of the Secretary-General of the United Nations for Human Rights in Cambodia. It updates the previous reports issued on July 1 and July 9, 1998.

The report provides information on the status of investigations into alleged acts of political violence in breach of international human rights standards. The Office has not been able so far to draw conclusions in all cases but investigations continue.

Summary:

One killing, two attempted killings and about fifty other credible allegations of intimidation and violence related to the electoral process have come to the attention of the COHCHR since July 9. The Office has also confirmed the discovery on July 4 of a dead body bearing signs of execution floating on the Mekong river in Mouk Kampuol district near Phnom Penh. In addition, the Siem Reap Provincial Election Committee informed the Office about the alleged killing (in April, May and two in June) of four purported CPP members in the province. This report summarizes the information received and analysed to date on the most significant of these cases and updates cases previously reported.

Intimidation of opposition party members and supporters as well as voters by local authorities has continued to be reported in Phnom Penh and in the provinces. It appears to have intensified in several provinces, such as Kompong Thom, as the elections approach. Mock elections as a new form of voter intimidation has been reported in at least five provinces.

Since May 20 1998, seventy-six out of 189 serious allegations of election-related violence or intimidation have been confirmed or assessed credible. All are listed in appendix. Allegations proven groundless or unrelated to the electoral process are deleted, while those not yet confirmed are being checked. During the same period, the Office has been investigating a total number of 13 killings, 4 alleged killings, 3 attempted killings, 7 illegal arrests and detention, 6 instances of physical abuse, 1 attempted abduction and over 150 credible allegations of harassment and intimidation related to the election process.

The Special Representative particularly draws to the attention of the authorities the cases of murder, attempted murder and violence, and strongly recommends to investigate them. The Special Representative and the Cambodia Office do not pass any judgment in these or other cases. As in the past, their role continues to be to assist the authorities and people of Cambodia to identify human rights problems which should be addressed by law enforcement and other relevant authorities.

Full report:

1. Update on previously reported cases:

- Court officials in Prey Veng have advised that they do not have sufficient evidence to prosecute the two suspects arrested in connection with the June 14 killing of Reastr Niyum Party member Phin Phon. The pair has now been released.
- A July 7 Ministry of Interior report on the investigation into the June 14 killing of Mrs. Mom Yeng, Kompong Trabek district, Prey Veng province has concluded that the perpetrator was the victim's son-in-law and the motive was personal and not political.
- The provincial police commissioner (CPP) for Siem Reap informed a human rights NGO that he thought the murder of the 3 CPP members on May 27 (see second report) was not political. The provincial chairman of the CPP stated to the COHCHR that he was not sure the case was political. These views have been corroborated by two witnesses.
- The Kompong Cham court informed the Office that FUNCINPEC district official Houng Sarun would be released soon. He had been arrested on 25 June while returning from a party rally attended by Prince and detained for illegal possession of a grenade. By 17 July, he was still detained.
- Correction: The two Sam Rainsy Party members illegally detained by the authorities of Phnom Penh's Village 15 were detained on July 5 and not June 28 as stated in the previous report.

2. New Cases under investigation:

Killing of Kith Kim in Kompong Thom province:

Kith Kim, also known as Smann Kim, aged about 60, was shot dead on the morning of July 5 as he was heading to tend his ricefield with his two daughters, near his village in Baray district of Kompong Thom province. He was a long-

tern FUNCINPEC member but local authorities only found out about his political affiliation when he became the FUNCINPEC observer in his village. The attacker(s) had been hiding in bushes waiting for him. The police stated that the gunman used either an M16 or an AR15 weapon and that there are only six in the commune, all belonging to the local authorities. They also stated that his killing was in revenge for his alleged "black magic" practices. Preliminary findings have identified both possible political and personal motives. Parallels have been noted in this case with the killing of Thong Soi on June 24 in neighboring Santuk district (see previous report).

Unidentified body found in Kandal province (Killing)

The body of an unidentified man bearing signs of an execution-style killing was found floating in a river by villagers in Mouk Kampul district of Kandal province on July 4. Witnesses interviewed by the COHCHR said nylon string was tied around the neck and one of his legs, and there were holes in the back of the head and lower back, possibly from gunshots.

Two attempted killings in Kompong Chhnang and Prey Veng:

- On the evening of June 15, three unidentified men, one of them wearing a military uniform and armed with a folding rifle, attempted to kill a healer and medicine seller in Samaki Mean Chey district of Kompong Chhnang province. The healer had registered as a FUNCINPEC electoral observer in his commune and was in charge of recruiting 16 other observers. At about 10:30 PM, the three men went to his home and called his name and said they wanted to buy medicine. Fearing danger, the healer asked his wife to respond. When she handed over the medicine, one of them, instead of taking it, grabbed her hand and pulled her down to the ground and pointed his gun against her neck. She shouted and called her husband to take his gun. The three men escaped, firing two gunshots, but hitting no one. The village chief who was called by relatives did not intervene. He stated that following this incident a FUNCINPEC member joined the CPP and three others were also expected to do the same. Initial findings indicate the possibility of a political motive.

- On the evening of 10 July, a villager who is also a FUNCINPEC Deputy Commune representative was injured by gunfire in an attempted killing against him in his village in Ba Phnom district of Prey Veng province. Two armed men whom he could not identify went to his house and immediately opened fire on him when they saw him. He was hit by a bullet in the thigh, ran away and went into hiding. On the following morning he was taken to hospital. He has not returned to his village where he fears he will be killed. This attempted murder follows several episodes of harassment and threats related to a land dispute since the victim joined the FUNCINPEC party in 1992 by other villagers affiliated with the CPP. Preliminary findings indicate both personal and political elements.

Two grenade attacks in Phnom Penh:

A grenade exploded in the vicinity of a city center amusement park on the

evening of 6 July in central Phnom Penh killing one person and injuring and eight others. In the second incident on 9 July two grenades were thrown in the yard of the home of the Minister of Justice but did not explode. The Office has found no evidence so far to link either incident to the electoral process

Four alleged killings in Siem Reap:

The Office was forwarded by the Provincial Election Committee four complaints of killings of alleged CPP members. The complaints concern the alleged killing in Don Peng commune on 11 April, 8 May and 27 June of three male villagers aged 74, 56 and 46, and the alleged killing on 26 May of a 66 year old villager. The CPP commune authorities have stated that the four killings were political but did not identify perpetrators. The Provincial CPP President told the Office on 15 June that he was not aware of these cases. The Office is investigating these allegations.

3. Other significant instances of intimidation and violence:

Confiscation of voters cards by local authorities, seemingly to verify their records, has continued in several provinces. In one district in Kompong Thom, for instance, on several occasions, opposition party members have had their cards confiscated. They were only returned after intervention by their party representatives with local authorities. Similar cases occurred in Siem Reap province in early July.

A new form of voter intimidation has been reported during the past week in several provinces: dry-run elections organized by village and/or commune officials and factory managers. Generally, these involve villagers and workers being called to a meeting at which they are told to fill in ballot papers which are then inspected to ensure that participants have correctly selected the CPP. The Office is currently documenting incidents of this kind in Takeo, Kompong Cham, Kandal, Pursat and Battambang.

The Office has also verified the following instances:

- the repeated night time surveillance beginning July 6 of a FUNCINPEC candidate's home in Pursat by a group of three unidentified men;
- the conspicuous surveillance and following by several unidentified men of a senior and active FUNCINPEC candidate for Takeo province, in Takeo and Phnom Penh on 8 and 9 July;
- the July 10 beating of a Sam Rainsy Party supporter in her home near Battambang town by a CPP cell leader who reportedly accused her of taking part in a Sam Rainsy Party parade in Battambang town that day;
- a FUNCINPEC National Assembly candidate for Koh Kong received on 10

July was called on the phone by a man who refused to identify himself. The caller invited him to meet co-Minister of Interior You Hokry at a certain location. After verification, it turned out that no such meeting had been requested by the Minister. On July 11 the same candidate was watched by four men in bodyguard uniform who stayed nearby his home;

- a senior Sam Rainsy Party official received an anonymous phone call on July 14 claiming to come from the Ministry of Interior and telling him that if he attempted to go to Pochentong airport to take a scheduled flight to Siem Reap he would be arrested. The caller accused the official of organizing demonstrations and being responsible for the grenade attacks of March 30 last year, and the two in Phnom Penh last week;

- a woman with FUNCINPEC connection who had been detained illegally earlier this year by provincial military in Koh Kong was approached in Chbar Ampeou market in Phnom Penh on July 13 by two unidentified men who asked her for information about her party's activities and plans. One of them, dressed in a military uniform and riding a motorbike with a military plate slapped her across the face, and threatened that her husband and children would be killed if she did not provide the information requested. The woman's daughter has been approached twice by men wearing military fatigues asking questions relating to her parents' political affiliation

- On 5 July 1998, a COMFREL official traveling to Anlong Veng to finalize the recruitment of 6 observers for the two communes of the district, was intimidated by the new district chief who is a former senior Khmer rouge cadre. The latter admonished him for not having sought his permission to recruit the 6 observers. He threatened him with arrest and told him that "COMFREL and human rights" were not welcomed in the district and that he should not stay because "only communist law" was allowed there.

The Office is also investigating the allegation that on 13 July at about 10:00 PM, two men fired six AK-47 bullets at a vehicle driven by Pol Sothea in a street of Phnom Penh's Tuol Kork district. Pol Sothea is fifth Sam Rainsy party candidate in Takeo province

POLITICAL VIOLENCE / INTIMIDATION – DEFINITIONS:

The following are definitions used for the types and status of allegations of political violence and intimidation recorded on the attached sheets. Some cases have involved multiple violations, and in this instance the most serious form is indicated.

TYPE:

The TYPE column lists the category into which the case falls.
